NON-TOXIC WEED KILLER

- * One gallon of white vinegar
- * 1 pound of table salt
- * 2 tablespoons of dish washing liquid

Dissolve salt in vinegar, add dish soap (helps the mixture cling to the leaves) and mix well.

Spray weeds thoroughly. *Be careful not to get on any plants you want to keep.*

NOTE: Some have found that using 1/2 cup of the dish washing liquid works much better as you don't have to re-spray as much.
