This group came about through the love of a small deaf puppy that needed to be transported halfway across the country to her new home. It took the effort and dedication of people from Texas to Washington D.C. and on to Ohio. It took the cooperation of three other rescue groups. In the end, it took the hearts of every one. BITSY's STORY continuing.....

My name is BITSY, because I am itsy bitsy. I weigh only 4.4lbs, but they tell me I am a dynamite little Papillon. I have spent all my life in a wire cage making babies. My owner decided I could not "produce" so I was discarded. A really nice lady Vet saved me and sent me here. I also had really bad back legs. I was born with a condition called patella luxation and because I could never find a stable walking surface, they got really bad and deformed. (Someone said I looked like a frog with rickets...sigh..) Now that I am 8 years old, arthritis has set in and I needed surgery in

order to be able to walk normally again. When my foster mom got me, I sorta would sit and scoot my back half along. She got me some pain medication and is trying to make my leg muscles stronger so I won't fall down so much, and so I can do the "bathroom" thing without laying down.

UPDATE: Bitsy had surgery and will be able to have the bandages removed this week (Nov 29). She has started putting her weight on the leg and should be walking on it within days to a week or so. She is not pain free, I am sad to report, as she could not tolerate the pain medications and she is still very anemic. But she is a trooper and never complains, even when she makes a mis-step and falls.

Through the generosity of many of you who heard/saw her story, we were able to pay for the right leg surgery. But Bitsy still needs medical attention and has the possibility of surgery on the other almost "good" leg. So let us help her just a little bit more?
